ELIZABETHTOWN COMMUNITY FAIR

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GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the Rules and Regulations of the Elizabethtown Fair.
2. **The Fair management reserves the right to amend and/or add to these Rules and Regulations as its judgments may determine.**
3. **Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from injury and damage, but the Fair is not in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft, or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.**
4. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to make known the proper name of the article or breed of livestock being entered. Any item entered improperly may be disqualified, but the judges will mark the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so that the same mistake in entering need not be made a second time.
5. **Chairpersons of each department reserve the right to refuse any entry.** Furthermore, the chairpersons reserve the right to bar from competition animals and/or products of decidedly inferior quality and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition. **Chairpersons may limit the number of entries per exhibitor.**
6. During judging, buildings, except livestock arenas, are to be closed to everyone except Fair officials, judges, Pennsylvania Fair Fund officials and necessary attendants. No exhibitor or his agent shall communicate with the judge during judging except to answer questions proposed by the judges. Any exhibitor interfering with the judges shall forfeit any premium to which he would otherwise be entitled.
7. Premiums, as listed, may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. The same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. The judges may, at their discretion, award a ribbon or rosette. All judges' decisions are final.
8. **The Fair management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit or part of exhibit in bad condition, sick or unruly.** The chairpersons must notify exhibitors of any exhibits that have become unfit. After having done so, the chairperson may dispose of the exhibit at his discretion.

ADDITIONAL RULES FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

1. All livestock entries must be entered through the Showman App by August 1st at midnight. Late entries will be accepted through the Showman App from August 2nd until August 8th at midnight. The cost of late entries will be \$25 per head.
2. All purebred breeding livestock must be accompanied by a certificate of registration which shall be available for chairperson or judge at any time.
3. Joint ownership is considered to be as one owner in accordance with registration papers. Youth livestock exhibits must be registered in exhibitor's name only.
4. In the event that an exhibitor has multiple livestock in the show ring for a particular class, only another youth livestock exhibitor entered at the Elizabethtown Fair may assist in handling the livestock.
5. **Exhibitors of sale livestock are limited to those residing in Columbia, Donegal, Elizabethtown, Hempfield, Manheim Central, Middletown, Lower Dauphin, Hershey and Palmyra School Districts.**
6. Market livestock will be weighed by Fair officials.
7. **Initial bedding will be supplied. Additional bedding must be supplied by exhibitor.**
8. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animal gaining the lower prizes shall move into the next higher position, if, in the opinion of the judges, the animals are worthy of the prizes.

9. All animals must be clean, properly clipped and fitted before show time. Chairperson reserves the right to disqualify animals.
10. **Any exhibitor removing their exhibit, without permission, prior to the permitted times will forfeit their premiums and be barred from competing the following year.**
11. Exhibitors may not set up before 2:00 a.m. on Thursday following the sale. Early set up will result in forfeiture of premiums. **There will be NO EXCEPTIONS.**

ADDITIONAL RULES FOR COMPETITIVE EXHIBITS

1. NEEDLECRAFT (Dept. 18) and ART, PHOTOGRAPHY AND CRAFTS (Dept. 19)
Entries will be accepted Saturday between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. and on Sunday between 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. **ONLY.** Entries in Departments 18 and 19 will not be accepted Monday.
2. LEGOS and K'NEX'S will be accepted on Sunday between 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. and Monday between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. These entries will not be accepted on Saturday.
3. ALL OTHER COMPETITIVE EXHIBIT ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED Monday between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. **ONLY.** This includes Hay & Grain located in Expo Hall on Fairgrounds.
4. ALL COMPETITIVE EXHIBIT ENTRIES are to be registered online through the Showman App by midnight August 21, 2026.
5. All competitive exhibitors must sign the entry form verification stating that they have read, understand and agree to abide by all rules established by the Fair.
6. The Competitive Exhibit Hall will be open Tuesday from 4:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., Wednesday through Friday from 12:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m., and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Church facilities will be open and available to the public during these hours only.
7. **PICK UP DAY WILL BE SUNDAY FOLLOWING THE FAIR.** Exhibits must be picked up Sunday **between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.** In accordance with PA State Law, any exhibitor removing their exhibit prior to this time will forfeit their premiums and be barred from competing the following year.

PREMIUM CHECKS

Competitive exhibit premium checks will be available from 6 p.m. Thursday through 5 p.m. Saturday at the church. Market and Breeding livestock, dairy premium and sale checks will be available from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday at the church. Unclaimed premium checks may be claimed during business hours at Brandt's Farm Supply, 601 E. High Street, Elizabethtown, PA during the month of September. Any premiums not claimed during these times will be forfeited. All checks not cashed in 60 days will be void and considered a donation to the Elizabethtown Fair.

The fair will accept self-addressed, stamped envelopes for payment of premiums.

ELIZABETHTOWN FAIR

CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

The Elizabethtown Fair has developed a Code of Show Ring Ethic to curtail unethical, deceptive and fraudulent show ring practices. The Code is as follows:

Exhibitors or livestock at the Fair shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standard of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes at competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at the livestock show.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and may be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the Fair Board. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all live stock Exhibitions and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of GUIDELINES for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of show official, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age or any fact relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their own animals at the show.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal and state statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal and state statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.
If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal wither internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in questions, its integrity is preserved and all accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.
At any time an animal arrives on the Fairgrounds, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medication for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoof or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's conditions by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the Fair Board for violation of the Code of Show Ring Ethics. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings of disciplinary action taken by the Fair Board may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fair and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering an animal in the show is the giving of verification by the owner, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by this code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal and state statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infraction.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All livestock admitted to the Fair shall be identified by a unique and permanent ear tag, tattoo, brand or records of unique physical attributes.
2. A 2026 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required for all livestock. Certificates may be issued any time after July 17, 2026.
3. All livestock requiring Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the certificate.
4. Cattle and Sheep - Current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market animals are exempt). All rabies vaccinated animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or vaccination information must be included on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
5. Livestock presented for exhibition will be subject to inspection by show officials and will be rejected if evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease is apparent or if health certification or identification documentation is not acceptable.
6. Certification of Veterinary Inspection must be presented to Fair Officials prior to unloading.

HEALTH RULES FOR DAIRY AND BEEF CATTLE

All cattle must be accompanied by a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, signed by an accredited veterinarian, that should include a statement that the animal(s) identified have been properly immunized against IBR, P13 and BVD with annual boosters.

All cattle entering the Ag Complex must be identified with a 15 digit 840 ISO-compliant RFID ear tag. The only exception to this will be for cattle who were identified using a 900 series 15 digit ISO-compliant tag placed before January 1, 2015.

IMPORTANT! The date of the last live virus vaccination, or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations should be recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. **All vaccinations must be done by August 1, 2026.**

All breeding cattle must have current rabies vaccination.
(see General Livestock Health Rules)

HEALTH RULES FOR SHEEP

All sheep must bear an official U.S.D.A./A.P.H.I.S. ear tag to be exhibited at the show. Sheep on the voluntary scrapie program must bear the official ear tag, tattoo, or electronic ear implant. All sheep must be individually identified.

All breeding Sheep must have current rabies vaccination.
(see General Livestock Health Rules)

HEALTH RULES FOR GOATS

All goats must bear an official U.S.D.A./A.P.H.I.S. ear tag to be exhibited at the show. The only exceptions are those goats that have a registration tattoo and have been coded with a premise I.D. number.

HEALTH RULES FOR ALPACAS

All alpacas to be displayed must be accompanied by a "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" (CVI) issued within 30 days of the start of the Fair and signed by an accredited veterinarian. A copy of the CIV must accompany the alpacas to the show and be always available for inspection during the show. All animals must be individually identified on the CVI.

USE CAUTION WHEN FITTING YOUR LIVESTOCK

Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy livestock when fitting your livestock for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy livestock, **do not use it!**

****Important!**** If upon slaughter treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.

SUPREME CHAMPION EVENTS

On Wednesday, August 26, at 4:30 p.m., the SUPREME MARKET CHAMPION will be chosen prior to the Sale of Champions. The Grand Champion Sale Livestock (Swine, Beef, Dairy Feeder Calves, Sheep, Goat and Rabbit) will compete for the Supreme Champion Market Livestock of the Fair.

A cup trophy will be awarded to the winner. The trophy will be kept by the winner for one year. The trophy will be retired with two consecutive yearly wins by the same exhibitor. This competition is for youth only. The Supreme Champion Livestock trophy is being sponsored by Groff's Meats, Inc.

The auction sale order will be rabbit meat pens, dairy feeder calves, beef, goats, market lambs, and swine.

(NOTE 4% will be deducted from all sale checks.)

DAIRY CATTLE
OPEN SHOW**

RULES:

1. **Entry fees must be submitted through the Showman App by midnight August 1st.**
2. Exhibitors must agree with the Code of Show Ring Ethics .
3. Exhibitors must abide by Livestock Health Rules listed in Premium Book.
4. All livestock are to be accompanied by certificate of registration and transfer card when livestock have been purchased. Verification could be asked for at the time of entering the show ring and must be available for the Chairperson or the judge at any other time. 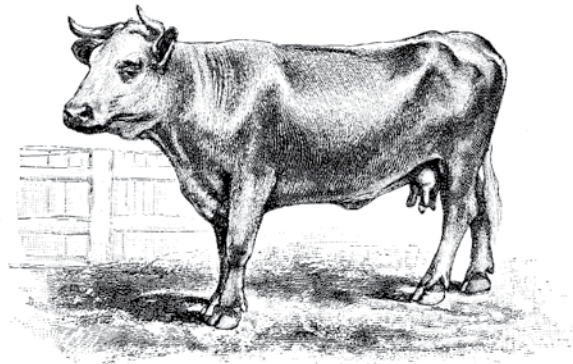

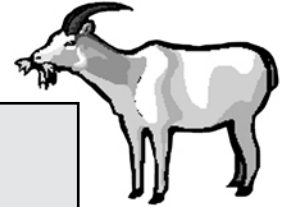

3. Read premium material carefully, following all rules and regulations. **Exhibits will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens are not entered.**

4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars and any fillings and frostings, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex. No pre-made mixes, cookie dough pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must be edible.
5. **At least two (2) PA Preferred™ ingredients** or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (such as oats or flour), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. A PA Preferred™ logo is not required because not all PA Preferred™ products carry the label. For assistance with qualifying ingredients. Contact [RA-AGPAPreferred @pa.gov](mailto:RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov). The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient.
7. The PA Preferred™ entry and its recipe will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
8. Entry must be submitted for judging **on a food safe disposable setting**. Nothing will be returned.
9. Recipe must be submitted with the entry, printed on one-side of 8 1/2" x 11" paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities and the preparation instructions. **The name of each PA Preferred™ ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product.** (ex: PA Preferred™ Milk Galliker’s, Apples-Smith Farms Orchard) Entrant’s name, **age**, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all pages.

8. Refrigeration is **NOT** available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
9. Judging Criteria:

Flavor (aroma, taste, good balance of flavoring)	40 points
Inside Characteristics (texture & lightness)	30 points
Overall Appearance (surface, size, color)	20 points
Topping (icing or decoration)	10 points

The Blue Ribbon Apple Pie will be selected from the four first place apple pies - the first place one-crust and two crust pies in the adult and youth divisions in Department 15.

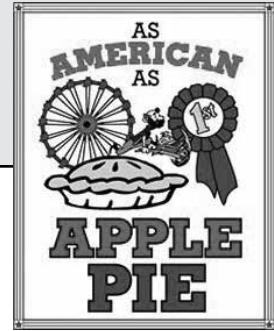

5. The entire pie must be submitted in a disposable pie pan. Nothing will be returned.
6. The pie entry and its recipe will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
7. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry (printed on one-side of 8 1/2" x 11" size paper). The recipe must list ingredients, quantities and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all pages.
8. Refrigeration is **NOT** available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or other wise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

FROG JUMPING CONTEST

RULES:

1. This contest is open to youth and adults of all ages. There is no entry fee.
2. Contestants must supply their frog. Any species or size of frog is eligible.

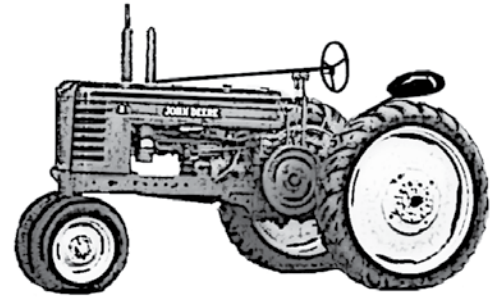
